Mark White read English at Oxford before working backstage in the music industry for a variety of bands. After eight years as a stockbroker he did his MBA at the London Business School and then joined CDC Capital Partners, making project finance and private equity investments in several emerging markets around the world, later moving to South Africa to set up and run a fund on behalf of CDC and Investec. Mark took over the seed investment operations at NESTA in 2001 and now manages a team of seven investment managers and a portfolio of over 100 investments, with



an average size of around £100K (Euro 150K). The investment strategy is to target high growth technologies at, or around, the stage of the formation or spinning out of the company. With a mixture of direct and indirect (through providing mentoring and the recruitment of management) NESTA then helps the company to develop the proposition to bring in further finance and strategic investment. Investments to date total around £13M (Euro 20M) and range from life sciences (eg drug delivery and diagnostics), through engineering and instrumentation (eg a redesign of the heat exchanger or a microscope able to deal with nanoscale), to consumer products (a redesign of the woman's shoe)

John Goodger is a director of The Great Eastern Investment Forum and has, since its formation in 1995, assisted in the vetting and prepresentation training of the investee companies as well as having worked on the creation of the membership base of smaller company funders. He is also a director of NW Brown Corporate Finance and has been involved with smaller quoted and unquoted companies based in the Cambridge area for over 17 years. Following periods with a clearing bank and a London based fund manager; John spent five years as a financial



journalist at the Investors Chronicle. He has over 20 years' experience in the field of corporate and investor communications advising both unquoted and quoted companies on all aspects of their internal and external relations. He has been on the board of a number of quoted companies (fully listed and AIM) where, amongst other activities, he has assisted with their corporate development and acquisition strategies.
